



## Rural Animal Technician Level 5 40 Week - Full time (2022)

In 2022 AGC Training has designed and developed a new Rural Animal Technician Level 5 programme. This programme is designed to create authentic and real-life learning experiences that produces job-ready graduates.

Programme components have been designed to align with the seasons, so that students can engage in real-time learning as it happens on the teaching farm, as well as in work-placements.

This programme supports individuals to develop the skills, knowledge, and attributes to work as rural animal technicians. Students are required to complete practical activities and a minimum number of hours in a veterinary practice or alongside a rural veterinarian.

Rural Animal Technicians assist veterinarians either in a large rural animal practice or in conjunction with a veterinarian as a technician in a farm setting. Farm setting may include a specialised field such as artificial insemination or pregnancy scanning.

This programme consists of six compulsory courses:

1. Introduction to Rural Animal Practice
2. Rural Animal Health and Nutrition
3. Reproduction and Disease in Rural Animals
4. Technical Tasks for Animal Health and Welfare
5. Clinical Communication and Sales
6. Pharmacology and Product



Successful completion of the programme leads to the award of the:

***New Zealand Certificate in Animal Technology (Level 5) Rural Animal Technician strand***

Graduates of this qualification will have demonstrated that they are able to:

- Work safely, ethically and professionally as a rural animal technician.
- Carry out routine clinical examinations of rural animals under supervision.
- Apply knowledge of different species and breeds when managing health and welfare of rural animals.
- Apply skills and knowledge to work effectively with a range of large rural animals as a rural animal technician.
- Proficiently carry out technical tasks associated with maintaining rural animal health and welfare.

Graduates of this qualification may be employed as rural animal technicians working with companion or rural animals.

To be eligible to enrol onto the programme, applicants must:

- have shown some commitment to working with animals and with the public,
- have completed 60 NCEA credits at level 2
- have a minimum of 12 NCEA credits in English at level 2 in Maths at level 1; and 12 credits of relevant science at level 1: or
- provide evidence of the equivalent tertiary study.

Students also need to be physically able to undertake practical activities in a rural setting.

Applicants will be interviewed prior to being accepted onto the programme.
